

## **TUITION FEES**

In the Czech Republic, academic programmes taught in foreign languages are required by law to charge tuition fees

# COLLABORATION WITH STANFORD

The Stanford U.S.-Russia Forum (SURF) is a student exchange program that brings together around 25 Russian and American students to work on joint projects.

The project implies online sessions and three annual conferences in 2024, 2025, and 2026



In cooperation with the Boris Nemtsov Educational Foundation's MA program, the SURF program will produce collaborative research by students from both countries on core issues of mutual interest to American and Russian participants.

Now more than ever there is an increased need for better mutual understanding and opportunities for person-to-person dialogue on common areas of interest. The SURF program anticipates a time when relations between the US and Russia are eventually more productive and constructive.

We seek, therefore, to build a foundation in the expectation that at some point, we will return to a time when the Russian and American governments and societies can constructively collaborate




