

## **Special requirements of the admission procedure for Follow-up Master's study programmes accredited in languages other than Czech 2026/2027**

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## Study programs in foreign languages

### AGLOPHONE LITERATURES AND CULTURES (ENG)

**specializations:** British and Commonwealth Literatures and Studies; American Literature and Studies; Irish Studies; Critical and Cultural Theory

**choosing a specialization:** at the end of Year 1; students submit one application for the entire study programme regardless of future specialization (students can choose only one specialization)

**form and type of study:** full-time, master's (follow-up graduate) programme

**number of applicants admitted in the previous academic year:** 1

**number of applicants in the previous academic year:** 3

**anticipated number of applicants to be admitted:** 10

**permitted combinations:** single-curriculum or double-curriculum study; the study programme may be combined with either the *Logic* or *Hebrew and Jewish Studies* programmes

**admission without entrance examination:** not permissible

**language of instruction:** English

**Study fees:** Appendix No. 2 to the CU Constitution – Fees for Study

**entrance examination:** one-round (written)

**entrance examination description** (assessment of submitted materials for MA project without the applicant present)

- a) Preliminary MA project proposal (presentation of academic competencies of applicant, non-binding for study realization) in English in 900–1 000 words: 0–80 points
- b) Selected bibliography for MA project proposal in English in 200 words: 0–20 points

**Ad a)** Applicants submit the MA project proposal through the Student Information System no later than the date specified in the Entrance exams schedule at CU FA.

**assessment criteria for the MA project proposal:**

- 80-65: clear and inventive, perhaps some minor mistakes or inconsistencies
- 64-50: acceptable overall, some issues but still showing promise
- 49-35: average in all respects but acceptable despite issues
- 34-20: poor, little promise, only a hypothetical chance of acceptance
- 19-1: major issues, no merit
- No proposal submitted: 0 points

**Ad b)** A selected bibliography of at least 10 sources, with one discussed in detail regarding its relation to the MA project and its methodology, is to be submitted through the Student Information System no later than the date specified in the Entrance exams schedule at CU FA.

**assessment criteria for the bibliography:**

- 20-15: relevant choice of secondary material, well-structured, the selected source tied convincingly to the MA project, only minor issues
- 14-10: well-structured selection of secondary material, some issues with the selected source but acceptable overall
- 9-5: mediocre presentation and secondary material selection, persistent issues
- 4-1: poor presentation, major issues (e.g. missing selected source)

- Failure to submit the bibliography will result in 0 points.

**entrance examination:** one-round (oral)

**entrance examination description:**

**Oral exam**

- a) A debate on study motivation and the MA project proposal: 0–30 points
- b) Jewish world realia exam (culture, history and geography): 0–40 points
- c) Language competencies exam – reading and translating a text in Modern or Biblical Hebrew: 0–30 points

**Ad a)** Applicants submit the MA project proposal and a motivation letter through the Student Information System no later than the date specified in the Entrance exams schedule at CU FA.

## LOGIC (ENG)

**form and type of study:** full-time, master's (follow-up graduate) programme

**number of applicants admitted in the previous academic year:** 0

**number of applicants in the previous academic year:** 1

**anticipated number of applicants to be admitted:** 5

**permitted combinations:** single-curriculum or double-curriculum study; the study programme may be combined with either the *Hebrew and Jewish Studies* or *Anglophone Literatures and Cultures* study programmes

**admission without entrance examination:** not permissible

**language of instruction:** English

**Study fees:** Appendix No. 2 to the CU Constitution – Fees for Study

**entrance examination:** two-rounds (written – assessment of materials submitted; followed by an oral interview)

**entrance examination description:**

**1. round – written exam** (assessment of submitted materials for MA project without the applicant present)

- a) MA project proposal in English in 900–1 000 words: 0–50 points

**2. round – oral exam** (the exam focuses on topics covered in subjects during BA Logic studies, the applicant must display the skills of a BA Logic graduate)

- b) Classical Logic I, II (for example subjects ALG119011, ALG119012 and ALG119007 in CU system): 0–20 points

- c) Set Theory and Recursion Theory (for example subject ALG110007 in CU system): 0–20 points
- d) Philosophy of Logic (for example subject ALG119003 in CU system): 0–10 points

**Ad a)** Applicants submit the MA project proposal (circa 5 pages long) through the Student Information System no later than the date specified in the Entrance exams schedule at CU FA. The proposal should adhere to established academic standards and contain sources. It should be clearly set and formulated, propose an original point of view of a certain topic in the field of logic and have the potential to be made into an MA thesis during the course of study.

research proposal evaluation criteria:

- The proposal is a clearly formulated and exhibiting expertise, contains only minor deficiencies: 50–38 points
- The proposal is a clearly formulated and exhibiting expertise, contains major deficiencies, but is still acceptable: 37–25 points
- The proposal is weak and unconvincing, very low probability of successful completion of project: 24–13 points
- The proposal totally unsatisfactory, exhibiting poor knowledge of the topic: 12–1 points
- Failure to submit project proposal: 0 points

**Ad b, c, d)** the exam questions correspond to matter studied in the BA Logic study programme at CU FA. The syllabi for the subjects can be found in the CU system: <https://is.cuni.cz/studium/>.

**Distance entrance exam request:** Within the deadline specified in the Entrance exams schedule and for serious and well-documented reasons, it is possible to submit a request through the Student Information System for the oral examination to be conducted remotely in the form of a video conference.

- a) Demonstration of English language proficiency at least at level B2 according to the CEFR in the form of a discussion about motivation to study: 0–20 points
- b) Demonstration of knowledge of Russian history: 0–40 points

- c) Demonstration of knowledge of sociopolitical reality of contemporary Russia: 0–40 points
